### Responsibility of the Person in Charge - AS Special Regulation 1.02.

- **1.02.1.** The safety of a boat and its crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the person in charge who shall do their best to ensure that the boat is fully found, thoroughly seaworthy and manned by an experienced crew who have undergone appropriate training and are physically fit to face bad weather. They must be satisfied as to the soundness of hull, spars, rigging, sails and all gear. They shall ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained and stowed and that the crew know where it is kept and how it is to be used. Attention is drawn to Regulation 2.04 that specifies the crew experience required for some races. They shall also nominate a person to take over the responsibilities of the person in charge in the event of his incapacitation.
- **1.02.2.** The establishment of these Special Regulations, their use by race organisers, and the inspection of a boat under these regulations does not in any way limit or reduce the complete and unlimited responsibility of the person in charge.
- **1.02.3.** The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a cruising event or race, or to continue racing is hers alone RRS Fundamental Rule 4

Your attention is drawn to ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028 Fundamental Rule 1.2 - Life-Saving Equipment and Flotation Devices.

"A boat shall carry adequate life-saving equipment for all persons on board, including one item ready for immediate use, unless her class rules make some other provision. Each competitor is individually responsible for wearing personal buoyancy adequate for the conditions".

#### Risk Warning.

This RISK WARNING is issued jointly by the Greenwich Flying Squadron Inc. (GFS) and Transport for NSW (TfNSW), pursuant to the Civil Liability Act 2002 to all persons wishing to participate in the sailing activities conducted by Greenwich Flying Squadron.

Participants are warned that, regardless of the precautions, which might be taken by reasonable and experienced persons, sailing can be a dangerous pursuit and participants are exposed to significant risk of property damage, physical harm and possibly death. As an indication, these risks may include, but are not limited to:

- The extremes of weather and sea conditions.
- The potential that control of vessels may be lost, resulting in collision with objects and other vessels.
- The sudden movement of the vessel at any time and the possibility that participants may fall or be thrown overboard, resulting in drowning.
- The possibility that participants may be injured by equipment on the vessel.
- The absence of immediate medical care and the likelihood that significant delays may occur before medical care is available.
- Exposure to the elements for extended periods.

Greenwich Flying Squadron and the Transport for NSW also warn participants that regardless of their best intentions, they may be unable to render assistance to participants who are in distress. Participants are warned to consider the above risks and all other risks before deciding to participate in any sailing event with Greenwich Flying Squadron.

Participants are also advised that although Greenwich Flying Squadron is covered by third party liability insurance, this cover DOES NOT extend to participants. Any participant who considers they have a need for insurance must make their own private arrangements with an insurer. A personal accident insurance policy is available with subscription to membership of Sailing Australia.

#### **Declaration by Owner or Representative.**

I have read and understand the Risk Warning printed above.

NOTE: Auditors do not inspect items referred to in Regulations 2.04; Section 3, Part 1; or Section 6. Refer to 2.02.2 – Owners must satisfy Organising Authorities as to those items when required to do so.

I undertake that all of the boat's equipment as specified in the Sailing Australia Special Regulations 2025 - 2028 will remain on the boat and continue to be in good working order and repair and in date (where applicable) for the duration of each and every race. I undertake that I will have in place at least \$10,000,000 of racing insurance cover for personal injury and property damage for each and every race. I further undertake to keep a completed GFS Safety Card in the yacht's cockpit when racing. These undertakings are given in consideration for the Greenwich Flying Squadron Inc. permitting me to participate in GFS organised races.
